As for the worldly goods whiche god of his goodness hath bestowed upon me I do give them in the following. I give and bequeathe to my son Richard Stiffe the same of thirty shilling to be paid to him within one year after my decease. Item I give to Margery Stiffe daughter of the said Richard one sheep. Item I give and bequeathe to my daughter Elizabeth Stiffe the same of five pound to be paid to her at the day of her marriage. Item I give and bequeathe to my son Edmund Stiffe the same of Robert Stiffe my son and sheep. And to Edmund Stiffe the same of John Stiffe my son and sheep. To Agnes Willis daughter of Robert Willis my son in law one sheep. Item I give and bequeathe to my son Robert Stiffe one warne and all my plough harness, weatsever after the death of me. The best of all my good and dutfull workes, movable and immovable. I give and bequeathe to Margery my wyfe, whom I make and appointe my sole Executoe of this my will. And I do appointe my brother Richard Stiffe and Margery Stiffe to be the overseers of the same. Edmund Stiffe make his knowlesse hereof. Thomas Thaler Justice Chamberlain and Richard Stiffe. They owing to me. Arthur Stiffe of Derbyshire county, Shilling two excepting the price of one living Lamb, Arthur Turner of Litchfield county shilling and pence
